FROM THE FOUNDER

Every child deserves to see the light.

I grew up away from my parents, moving between foster homes and relatives. No one ever lit that road for me, so I have always carried one wish: one day, to be a light for someone else.

In 2016 I began organising volunteer activities at my own expense. On the day Super Typhoon Mangkhut struck in 2018, I started an online group to call for volunteers; more than 4,000 strangers answered and cleaned up all eighteen districts. That is how GreenFeet18 began.

Later I met children in subdivided flats just like the child I had been: full of dreams and talent, with no chance to use them. So we opened free classes and our Full Sponsorship Programme, to walk beside them as they grow; in 2025, with a partner, we went to The Gambia and taught from the very first power-on. I want to be a light for every child, so they can feel loved and see hope.

Sep 2018 It began with a typhoon

More than 4,000 volunteers clean up after Super Typhoon Mangkhut, and GreenFeet18 is born; *HK01*, *Ming Pao*, *RTHK* and other media report on the effort.

From 2018 Coastal clean-ups and volunteer service

100+ coastal clean-ups and 100+ volunteer service days to date, including hot-meal deliveries.

From about 2021 Full Sponsorship Programme begins

For children from subdivided flats and low-income families, from primary school onwards.

2022–23 Incorporated and recognised as a charity

Incorporated in October 2022; a section 88 charity from August 2023.

2023–24 15 free activities

222 family places and 533 attendances, including ten free interest and learning classes.

Jan 2025 Sing Tao Headline feature

A sponsored nine-year-old from a subdivided flat, training in karate.

2024–25 11 activities; public launch of Full Sponsorship

214 family places and 455 attendances, and 500 hot meals delivered.

Apr–May 2025 First steps in Africa

A joint team of 14 volunteers with a Hong Kong partner reaches 200+ people with food and helps start AI education.

Sep 2025 Support from athletes

Karate athlete Grace Lau and Ariel Torres donate part of a watch collaboration's proceeds to GreenFeet18 (52hrtt).

Oct 2025 Government-funded event

A community health event for the 2025 National Games, funded by the Yau Tsim Mong District Office.

2026 New programmes

Online applications, E-Cycle for Learning and *Fellow Travellers* films.

2023–24: 15 free activities

This year centred on free interest and learning classes, taught by instructors at reduced rates, giving children from low-income families chances they could not otherwise afford. Every activity was free to join.

Full Sponsorship Programme launch

Guests of honour included a Legislative Council member, the vice-chairman of Yan Oi Tong, a clinical psychologist and the founding president of the Asian Entrepreneurs Association.

Other regular activities (2023 to today)

- **English and Putonghua classes** for about 60 children
- **Free cinema screenings:** about six, around 100 people each; actor Louis Cheung came to one to thank the audience
- **Percussion class:** in 2025 we funded a term for about six pupils of a Ma On Shan primary school, with MC Music
- **Government-funded event:** a community health event at Mong Kok Community Hall on 14 October 2025, funded by the Yau Tsim Mong District Office, Home Affairs Department

From switching on a computer to believing they can

In April and May 2025, together with a Hong Kong partner organisation, we took a joint team of fourteen volunteers to The Gambia in West Africa to visit children, schools and communities, understand their needs and help start AI education for young people.

What the partnership did

- Visited several schools and many families, and distributed food, reaching more than 200 people
- Helped set up an AI learning centre so students have a stable place to study
- Volunteers taught basic computer skills and AI concepts, from the first power-on
- 40 students took part in the first phase
- One student has already used what they learned to earn their first income

Working with the authorities

Our joint team met officials of The Gambia's education ministry and of the Embassy of the People's Republic of China in The Gambia, to introduce the programme and discuss how it can support local education in the long term.

Full Sponsorship Programme

Running for more than four years, it fully sponsors children from subdivided flats and low-income families from primary school onwards. Parents, social workers and teachers can now refer children online, with a reply within 21 days.

E-Cycle for Learning

Idle laptops, tablets and phones from the public and companies are checked, refurbished and given to children who have no device at home, cutting e-waste at the same time.

Fellow Travellers

People from every walk of life share how they got through a hard time, in short films for children in Hong Kong and The Gambia. The first series, *To You at Twelve*, is recruiting now.

Hong Kong and overseas, one step at a time

In Hong Kong

- Sponsor more children as resources allow
- Grow E-Cycle for Learning with companies and the public
- Release the first *Fellow Travellers* films
- AI and digital courses for kindergartens, primary and secondary schools
- In the long run, children we support come back as volunteers and tutors

Overseas

- Return to The Gambia with our partners to continue and deepen the AI programme
- Take the model to a second country — seeking funding
- Long term: a network of locally run learning centres
